He Did It! He Did It! We Said That He Would Do It, Would Do It, Would Do It, & Did He Do! FDU — LFDL!

In this age of acronyms, you know by now that FDU stands for a Foundation that is out to Destroy Udvada! But what's this LFDL?

Look Face, Don't Laugh!

That's exactly what happened on the 24th November, 2006 to the trustees of the FDU, led by the Chairman, Dastur Khurshed, the Managing Trustee, D.K. DEATH KNELL FOR DOKHMENASHINI?

Some Thoughts on revitalising the sytem

I had an occasion to go to Doongerwadi on 14th October, 2006. Here are my observations.

Located in sylvan surroundings, the environs of the Towers of Silence reminded me of the words of the great Pesian poet Firdausi Tusi "Agar zinnat... zamin ast, hamin-ast wo hamin ast wo hamin ast". (English translation: If paradise was on earth, it would be here). Even beyond the gate where entry is prohibited, the same heavenly unpolluted atmosphere prevailed. And here fly the dragon-flies, a sure biological indication of purity of air. What lies still further on, is not meant for our

eyes to see, just as what lies buried a few feet underground.

An ideal system for the disposal of the dear departed would be one that makes him vanish instantaneously without the use of fire, electricity, water, soil, microbes and other scavenging creatures. Alas, we are nowhere near this utopian solution that defies the law of thermodynamics and ecology. The system that comes close to that prevailing in nature is that of Khurshed Nigarishni, exposing the dead to the elements of nature.

In their nearly 300-year-old history in Mumbai, the saga of the Towers of Silence remained silent till about the mid 40s of the last century. Reportedly the first murmurs came from the small towns that the vultures just pecked at the bodies and flew away. The new introduced antibiotics were supposed to be the reason for rendering the carrion unpalatable.

The problem exploded on a much larger scale 50 years later, when the vultures vanished. A recent news item of swarms of vultures in Peru posing a threat to aviation provides a ray of hope. A few birds could be imported, with the due precautions, and integrated into the aviary project that was on anvil at the Doongerwadi (Reference: Mr. Khojeste Mistry and Dr. Rishad Naoroji). However, with the widespread use of the drug Diclofenac in allopathy, the survival of the imported avians cannot be assured. This pain killer drug is held responsible for the extinction of vultures. Any substitute for vultures?

In spite of the raging controversy over the Dokhma system, no attempt whatsoever has been made to look for a suitable organism to replace the vulture. Vendidad makes mention of flesh-eating dogs but carnivores belonging to the dog and cat families are to be ruled out. A probable candidate is a mammal that goes by the name of "ghor-khodu" (grave digger, night raider). So fond it is of dead human flesh that it is reported to dig graves.

Of course a good deal of trials and experiments would be needed before introducing the animal in the disposal system, subject to the approval

of our High Priests and the community leaders.

As to the suitability of the Doongerwadi land as a burial site, questions do arise. The soil is shallow over the hilly terrain and erosion active over the slopes washing away the deposited soil. With an estimate of 1000 burials per year, would the land suffice to serve for two to three decades and more?

Construction of recent buildings around the dokhmas existing since centuries was not a wise step. On the other hand, citizens have a right to protest when a crematorium comes up in a crowded locality.
